Local Law No. 07 of the year 2014

A local law amending Chapter 52 entitled "Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals" of the Town of Thompson Code

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the

Town of Thompson

1. §52-3 E. is hereby amended to read as follows:

- E. If the Planning Board determines that a suitable park or parks or other outdoor recreational facilities of adequate size cannot be properly located in any subdivision plot; cluster development plan; mobile home park plan; PUD; hotel/motel plan; dormitories or other housing for educational facilities plan; or any other type of housing development where more than 5 dwelling units are proposed, or is otherwise not practical, the applicant shall remit a fee for recreational purposes in an amount as set by Resolution of the Town Board, per lot, per dwelling unit, per dormitory room unit, or per site units for each new lot, dwelling unit or site unit or hotel/motel or dormitory room unit, created as a result of the Planning Board's approval of said subdivision; cluster development; mobile home park plan; PUD; hotel/motel plan; dormitories or other housing for educational facilities plan, or other housing development of any type that contains more than 5 dwelling units.

- (1) The aforesaid recreation fees shall be payable to the Town and designated specifically to be used for park and recreational purposes for the Town of Thompson.
- (2) No final approval of site plan/subdivision plan shall be issued by the Planning Board until any designated park and recreation fees are paid by the applicant.
2. Except as herein specifically amended, the remainder of Chapter 52 of such Code shall remain in full force and effect.
3. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment, decree or order shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment, decree or order shall have been rendered and the remainder of this local law shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.
4. Except as herein otherwise provided penalties for the violation of this local law, any person committing an offense against any provision of the chapter of the Code of the Town of Thompson shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable as provided in Chapter 1, General Provisions, Article II, of such Code.
5. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the

1. The Town Board of the Town of Thompson, pursuant to the provisions of Article 14-F of the General Municipal Law, entitled "Sewer Rent Law", and in particular Section 452 thereof, does hereby establish and impose sewer rents to be charged in the Harris Sewer District, Harris Woods Sewer District, Dillon Farms Sewer District, Kiamesha Lake Sewer District, Melody Lake Sewer District, Sackett Lake Sewer District, Cold Spring Sewer District, Emerald Green-Lake Louise Marie Sewer District, and Anawana Sewer District, for the year 2015.
2. The rates to be charged pursuant to Chapter 197 of the Code of the Town of Thompson, Section 197-45, for the year 2015 are as follows:

WHEREAS, the Town retains the right to further increase the assessment of petitioner's real property if it is discovered that further improvements were made to the property that are not currently noted on the data sheets of the Assessor's Office and are in addition to the three structures already contemplated by this settlement which raised the assessed value to \$700,000.00; and

WHEREAS, petitioner will file a Stipulation of Discontinuance on the proceedings pending in the Supreme Court of the State of New York, County of Sullivan, under Index Nos. 1933-2005; 2252-2006; 2336-2007; 3072-2008 and 2853-2009.

The following resolution was duly moved, seconded and adopted:

WHEREAS, the County of Sullivan and the Town of Thompson entered into contract for Snow and Ice Control on County Roads from July 01, 2012 through June 30, 2015;

WHEREAS, the contract states the Town will be paid the amount Sullivan County received from the State of New York for snow and ice control on state highways the previous snow and ice season; and

WHEREAS, the County of Sullivan was paid the rate of \$5,657.38 per centerline mile for the 2013-2014 contract year; and

WHEREAS, said section of the Highway Law of the State of New York requires the approval by resolution of each of the legislative bodies of such County, Towns;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the County of Sullivan pay the amount of \$5,657.38 per centerline mile for two lane highways and \$8,486.07 for three lane highways to the Town for the contract year July 01, 2014 – June 30, 2015.

FURTHER, BE IT RESOLVED, that Town Supervisor William J. Rieber, Jr. hereby be authorized to execute such Agreement between the Town of Thompson and County of Sullivan regarding the above.

WHEREAS, all eligible employees hired prior to March 05, 2013 have non-contributory family health insurance coverage paid by the Town without any contribution from the employee; and

WHEREAS, the Town Code, under §48-15(E) provides that when a Town employee retires after age 55 with a minimum of 10 years of service, the Town will pay for the employee's individual and family health insurance that said employee was entitled to at the time of retirement; and for a married retired employee, coverage shall continue until the death of said employee or his/her spouse, whichever occurs later; and

WHEREAS, this provision was added in September, 2002, and all employees who retired prior to that date would have non-contributory health plans that continued until the death of the retired employee and would not cover the surviving spouse upon their death; and

WHEREAS, currently there are four surviving spouses of former Town employees who are required to contribute towards the health insurance since their spouses retired prior to 2002 and have since passed away. It is the intent of this Board to give those surviving spouses the same coverage as any employee who retired after 2002 when the Town amended §48-15(E) to include a retired employee's surviving spouse.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following surviving spouses of retired Town employees shall continue to receive health insurance benefits from the Town of Thompson: Helen Fraser, Sandy Callihan, Helen Calhoun and Ruth Bickham. The aforesaid surviving spouses shall be given the same status of all surviving spouses whose spouse retired subsequent to 2002 and shall have, going forward, from the date of passage of this Resolution, non-contributory health insurance plans provided by the Town pursuant to Town Code §48-15(E). Said coverage shall continue until their death, at no additional cost to them. This Resolution covers only the aforementioned surviving spouses and is not intended for the benefit of anyone not specifically named herein.


